



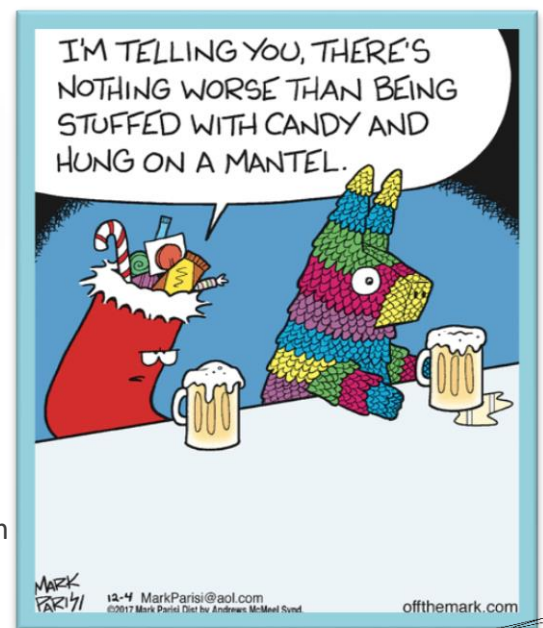

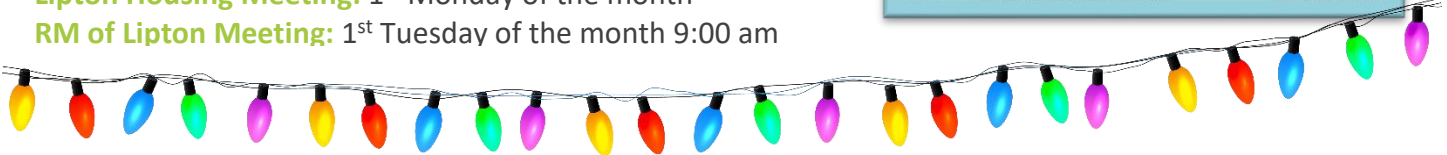
MANDATORY MASKING

Key FOBS for Truck Fill

The Village of Lipton now offers water FOBS. Instead of keeping a pocket full of coins for when it's time to haul water, you can now keep a FOB on your keychain. Payments can be made by cash in person at the office, cheque, or E-transfer. Your usage can be monitored by email, and information is readily available when needed. It's even printable if you need a receipt. There is a \$30 deposit required for the FOB. Contact us with any inquiries.

The Village office has rapid tests available free of charge. Please stop by the office to pick yours up if you would like to have them handy in your home.



Pet Tags

Do you have a dog or a cat that isn't registered with the Village? If so, please stop by to get your pets on file.

Registration is a one-time \$10 fee.

You fill out a short form and receive a small, metal tag to put onto your pets' collar.

Why bother? If your pet gets lost, the tag tells whoever finds your fur baby what Municipality they belong in, and provides a number that will be searchable at the Village Office so we can get your pet home safely.

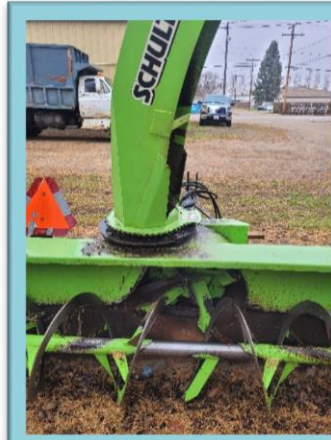
